

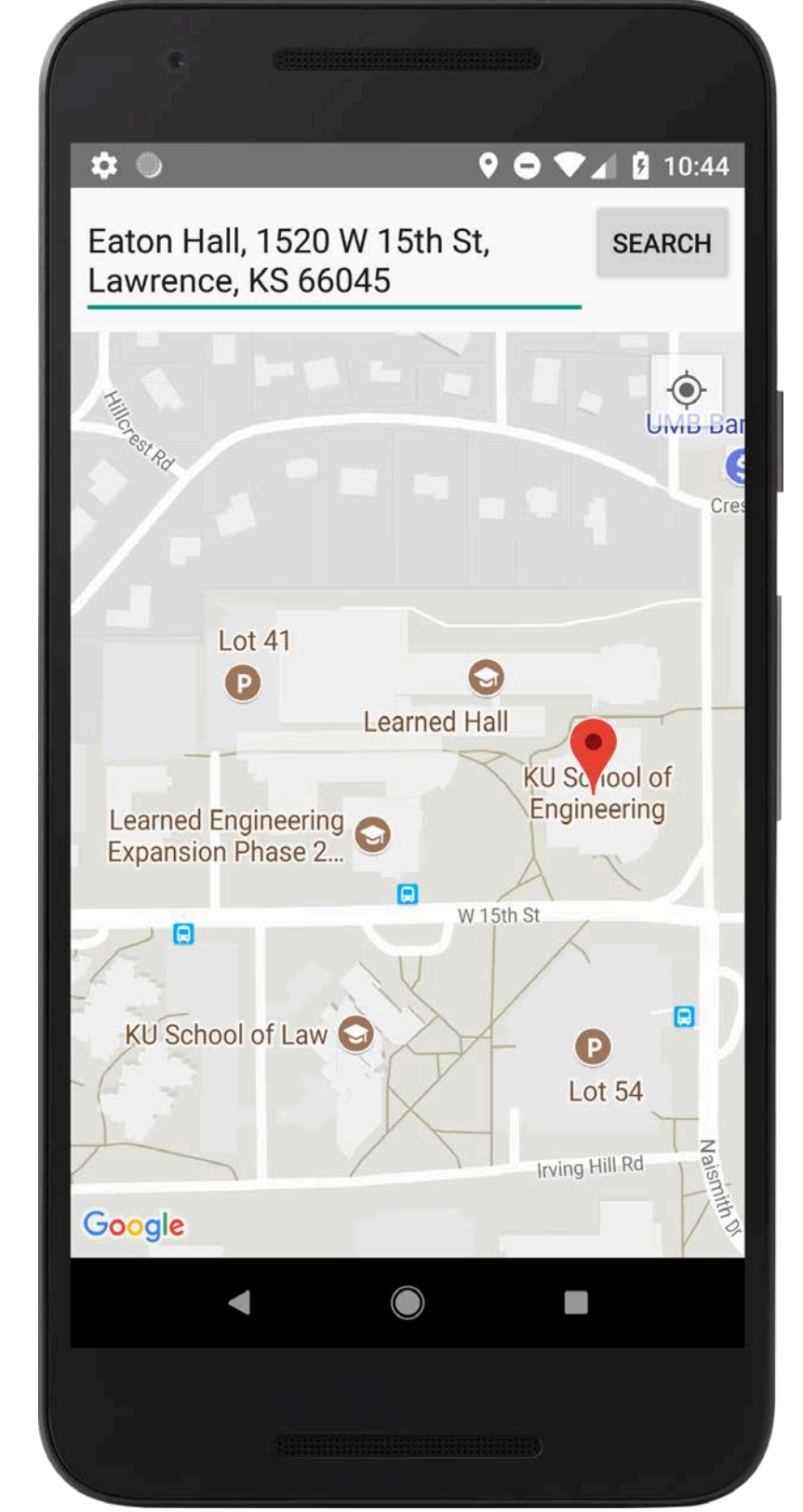
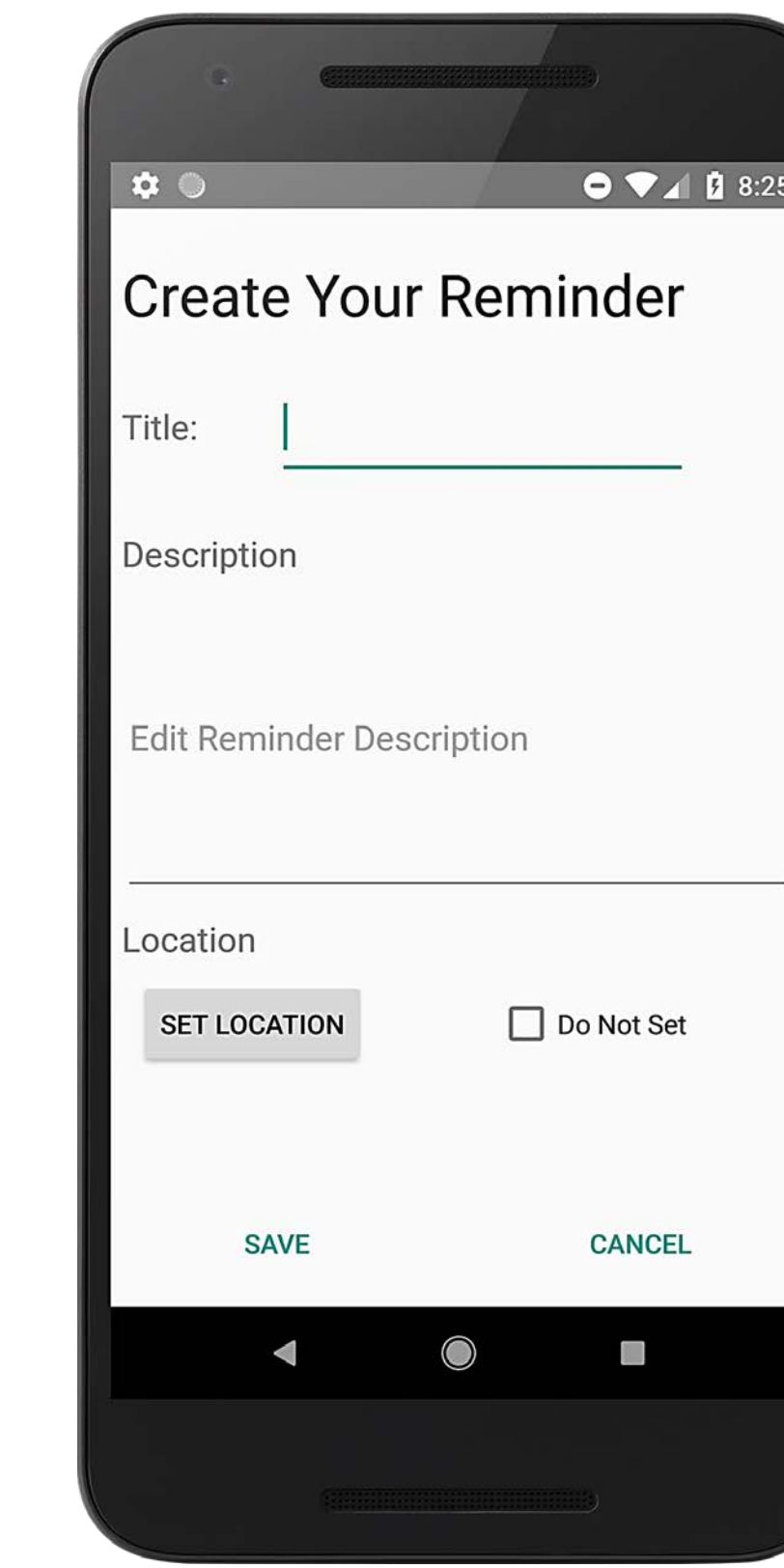
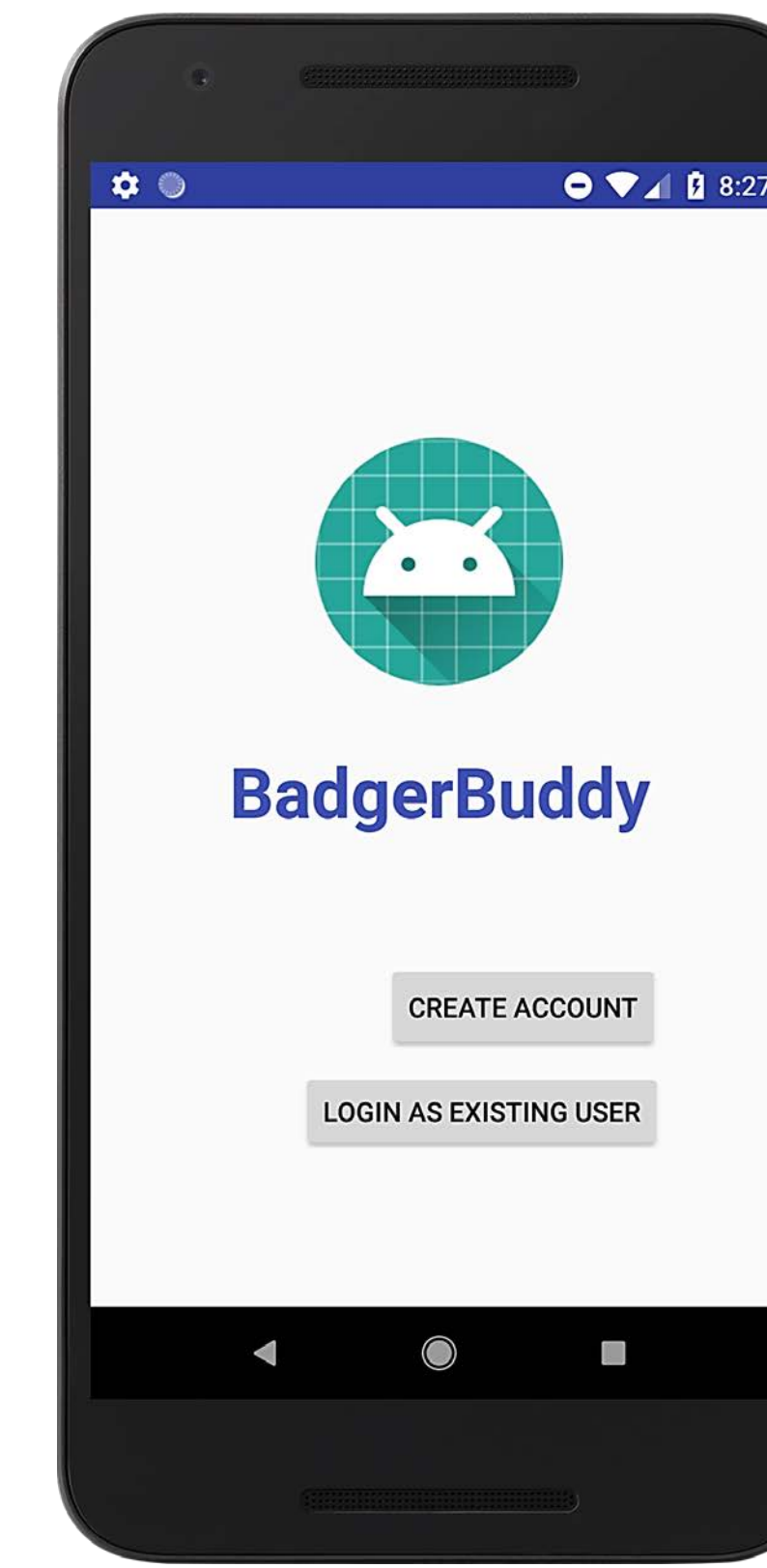


BadgerBuddy

Description & Purpose

- BadgerBuddy is an Android application that grants users the ability to set reminders for themselves complete with detailed descriptions, times, and locations.
- Users can also connect with friends and family members and inform them about tasks that need to be completed and events going on around them.
- BadgerBuddy provides a more engaging user experience than typical to-do list applications by providing a platform in which users coordinate their daily routines with the people in their social circles.

Ethical & Intellectual Property Issues

- BadgerBuddy sets alarms based on the current time of day and tracks the location of the user's phone. Those concerned about privacy should know that the application does not demand that users make use of either of these features.
- Some users may be concerned about the privacy of the notes that they create for others. They can rest assured that BadgerBuddy grants them full control of who receives which content.
- Other applications, such as "Reminders" on iOS platforms, provide similar to-do list functionality. Our group believes that we have properly differentiated our application from others on the market in both design and implementation with the addition of a social aspect and the Google Maps integration.
